


The Clean Power Plan (CPP)

- EPA rule to reduce CO2 emissions from existing power plants 32% by 2030
- Emission rates for 2 categories of "affected EGUs"
 - → steam generating units
 - natural gas combined cycle units
- Alternative forms of emission goals for each state:
 - State-wide average emission rate
 - total tons of emissions per year
- Glide path
- States develop plans

Legal Status

- West Virginia v. Environmental Protection Agency
- Supreme Court granted a request for a "stay" pending judicial review
- DC Circuit Federal Court of Appeals will hear arguments September 27
- Date for initial submittal won't be enforced and the date for final plans will also probably slip

State Plan Options



^{*} State measures will lead to reductions in emissions by affected EGUs

Interactions: RPS and the CPP

- RPS and rate-based plans
 - How ERCs are used
- RPS and mass-based plans
- RPS in a state measures plan

How ERCs Are Used


- Actual rate (lbs/MWh): = <u>Emissions (lbs)</u> Generation (MWh)
 - If the actual rate is higher than the emission rate standard for that affected EGU, the EGU acquires ERCs
 - **The ERCs** are added to the denominator as zero emission MWh to lower the rate:
- Adjusted rate (lbs/MWh) = Emissions (lbs)

 Generation (MWh) + ERC (MWh)

Interactions: RPS and the CPP

- RPS and rate-based plans
- RPS and mass-based plans
 - to the extent it displaces in-state generation at affected EGUs
- RPS in a state measures plan
 - quantifiable, verifiable, enforceable, nonduplicative, and permanent

Timing of RPS and CPP



^{*} New York's governor has directed the PSC to adopt a new standard of 50% by 2030

ERCs, Allowances—and RECs

- Emission rate credit (ERC) = a zero-emission MWh
- REC = generation attributes of one MWh
- Do ERCs and RECs double-count the same thing?
 - EPA: separate instruments, not double counting
- Allowance = authorization to emit a ton of CO₂
 from an affected EGU

CPP and Certificate Tracking Systems

- EPA-administered and EPA-approved tracking systems
- ERC tracking
- A state and its agent
- Allowance tracking
